DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. Who was your favorite character in *Never Alone*, and what about them did you connect with?
2. Choose a character and describe what qualities they demonstrated that helped them overcome challenges throughout the story.
3. What events in the story reminded the characters that they were never truly alone? How did those moments change them?
4. What do you think was the greatest obstacle the friends faced, and how would you have handled the situation differently?
5. Throughout the story, the characters rely on one another for encouragement and support. Why is it important to ask for help when facing a difficult challenge?
6. Describe a time when someone helped you through a difficult situation or when you helped someone else. What did you learn from that experience?

EXTENSION ACTIVITIES

HELPING HANDS - Throughout *Never Alone*, the characters discover the importance of helping one another during difficult times. Ask students to think about someone who has helped them or someone they have helped. Have them write a short story, journal entry, or create a poster describing the situation, how it made them feel, and what they learned about kindness, friendship, and teamwork. Invite students to share their work with the class and discuss how small acts of kindness can make a big difference.

POND HABITATS - The animals of Aeternus Pond depend on one another and on a healthy habitat to survive. Have students research one pond animal featured in the story, such as a snapping turtle, leopard frog, or goldfish. Students should create an informational fact sheet that includes the animal's habitat, diet, life cycle, predators, and adaptations for survival. Encourage students to compare their animals and discuss how each contributes to the pond ecosystem.
